8. OLD BUSINESS (TAB 2)

A. Substitute Teacher Staffing Service

After evaluating the responses, we received for our RFP (Request for Proposal) for Substitute Teacher Staffing Services, staff recommends that the contract for Substitute Teacher Staffing Services be awarded to StaffEZ, formerly PESG, for either their Standard or Alternate Proposal for the 2019/2020 school year. The contract will have an option to renew for two further years.

Our actual sub usage during the 10-week period from 11/26/18 through 2/15/19 was used as the base for preparing the weighted cost comparison. Then this usage was annualized for the total numbers used in the tab in the agenda.

Cost is 50 of the 90 points we used to evaluate the sub proposals.

StaffEZ's standard proposal (2^{nd} column) is the 2^{nd} lowest cost proposal. SPUR, the lowest cost proposal, simply did not have enough points awarded in the other factors to move them up in the evaluation ratings.

Three years ago, we went with the PESG (now StaffEZ) alternate proposal because of the 97% fill rate guarantee. The yellow (\$246,000) is what PESG has paid from their administration fee for sub bonuses in order to get the fill rate up. The blue \$220,000 is an estimate of the cost Rutherford County would have to pay in order to maintain StaffEZ's Bonuses for working so many days per month. Our frequent subs are used to receiving this pay. The proposals are shown this way so that you can see that the StaffEZ proposals are pretty close in total cost if Rutherford County Schools choose to continue the bonus plans.

Under the Alternative plan the bonuses that StaffEZ is currently paying to staff hard-to-fill schools would continue to be paid by PESG out of their administration fee. Since there is a performance penalty, StaffEZ will have an inducement to continue improving their fill rate.

On the other factors, accounting assigned the points for cost and record keeping. Dr. Anthony and I decided together the fill rate and plans to improve the fill rate. Dr. Anthony researched and asked questions before awarding the points for the last two factors.

B. STOPit Solutions Contract

STOPit is a mobile and web based incident software that allows students and administration to communicate anonymously to maintain a positive school climate. Students can report anonymously via mobile app, or phone hotline service for bullying/cyberbullying, inappropriate teacher/student relationships, violence/threats, hazing, weapons possession, drugs/alcohol, substance abuse, and intolerance/discrimination. This package also includes dedicated incident screening service which reviews and triages incoming reports. STOPit will provide a streamlined process and improve the efficiency and effectiveness of investigations with STOPit's case management system. Contract Details: July July 1, 2019 - June 30, 2020. Total Contract Fees = \$25,850.00.

10. TITLE III EXTENDED CONTRACTS (TAB 3)

The ESL Department will be conducting a 6-week summer school program at Smyrna Middle School, funded completely by Title III funds. These funds will provide 3 teacher extended contracts and transportation costs. The dates of the Summer School are June 3-July 12, 2019 from 8:00 a.m. – 12:00 p.m. Ms. Abdelmasseh, Ms. Vigil and Ms. Anand have agreed to supervise the summer school program. Chip Industries will receive \$2,668.00 to provide transportation.

Recommend Approval---motion to approve a Rutherford County Schools Title III funded contract with Mervat Abdelmasseh, Meghan Vigil, Sweety Anand and Chip Industries for the six-week summer school program to be held at Smyrna Middle School.

The Board shall either review the record or grant a second hearing.

If the Board chooses to review the record, it shall:

The notification system provides the district with the ability to send messages directly to parents via phone, email, text newsletters and through social media and is an invaluable component of the district's communication plan. Previously, the service through School Messenger/West cost the district \$66,500 annually. The new proposal will save the district \$9,000 at a rate of \$1.25 per student for a total first year cost of \$57,500.

12. FINANCIAL MATTERS

A. Student Information System

Our current Student Information System INow, will not meet the Tennessee Department of Education EdFi data transmission requirements next year. Tennessee school districts currently using Chalkable's student information systems, INow, must select a new SIS vendor. After meeting with and reviewing the four State approved vendors, the recommendation is to select Skyward.

The cost to migrate all data from INow to Skyward beginning with the 2006-2007 school year to present, including implementation and training for the district, is \$256,125.00.

The per student cost for 2019-2020 is \$4.25 per student based on 45,844 ADM for a total cost of \$194,837.00. The cost for year two and year three will not exceed \$4.50 per student. Included in the contract is an LMS API at a cost of \$11,461. The LMS API will be used to facilitate data transmissions between the student management system and third-party applications and learning management systems used by the district. The total cost for 2019-2020 year is \$206,298.00.

History of Moving Spouses with Coverage off our Plan

In the 2016/17 general purpose school budget we were able to budget just over a 10% savings in medical insurance for the second half of the year. (The plan changes become effective in January for the second half of the fiscal year.) In addition to an overall rate increase that was 4% vs 12% we planned that 20% of these spouses would leave our plan.

The actual number of spouses leaving our plan was closer to 50%. We ended up savings about \$3,968,000 in the second half of fiscal 2016/17 that was attributable to the lower rate increase and spouses moving off the plan - \$41,968,000 vs \$38,000,000.

A. Capital Projects Request

Maintenance is requesting to reallocate the \$500,000.00 in Capital Projects funds for a chiller replacement for Central Magnet to Blackman High School. Now the two chillersat Blackman are nearing failure and maintenance believes they can delay the request for Central Magnet until 2019-2020 budget year. This request will also have to be approved by the County Commission.

WHEREAS, Company is in the business of providing temporary staffing services; and

WHEREAS, the Board operates primary and secondary schools in Rutherford County and is in need of substitute teacher/educational assistant temporary staffing services; and

WHEREAS, the Board desires to retain the services of the Company to provide substitute teacher/educational assistant temporary staffing services for all of its schools, and the Company desires to provide those services, in accordance with provisions of this Agreement;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises, covenants, and agreements contained herein and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. <u>Description of Services</u>. Subject to the terms and conditions set out in this agreement, the Board hereby retains the Company to provide all substitutes for teachers, special education aides and Title I Pre-School Educational Assistants required at any and all of the schools under the Board's jurisdiction during the term of this agreement, and the Company agrees to provide these services in accordance with the terms of this agreement. A list of the schools and the approximate number of substitute teachers and special education aides which were needed during the 2018-2019 school year is attached hereto as EXHIBIT B. The number provided on Exhibit B are approximations, and are provided for illustrative purposes only and not as a representation of future requirements.
- 2. Request for Services. All requests for services shall be made by an authorized teacher/educational assistant, by contacting the designated Company representative. The Board will provide the Company with a current list of authorized teachers/aides, including social security number and school identification number, which list will be updated by the Board periodically. The Company shall designate in writing from time to time at least four (4) persons to serve as designated Company representatives for the purpose of accepting requests for services. The Company shall confirm that the request will be honored by notifying the authorized teacher, as follows: for planned leave (request for substitute made at least three (3) working days prior to the date leave is to begin), the Company must confirm by the school day following the request; for emergency leave (request for substitute made less than three (3) working days prior to the date leave is to begin), the Company shall confirm as soon as practicable after the request.

The Company agrees to use its best efforts to provide substitutes for all teachers and special education and pre-school educational assistants as requested. The company agrees to promptly notify the Board when all requests for substitutes are not filled. The Company further agrees to use its best efforts to provide the same substitute teacher to fill absences that continue for more than one day. The Company agrees to prioritize the use of certified substitutes for vacancies of twenty consecutive days or more in accordance with Rules, Regulations and Minimum Standards and HR 1- *No Child Left Behind*. The Company shall provide substitute usage data on a daily basis. (Exhibit G, a/b). The Company shall provide weekly reports disaggregating the substitute usage by 1) type of leaves; 2) by school; 3) by teacher and 4) a summary of weekly leave by day, school and type of leave

3. <u>Compensation for Services</u>. As full compensation to the Company for providing the services described herein, the Board shall pay the Company the following fees:

- D. type of board employee, e.g. teacher or educational assistant
- E. first eleven characters of the school system's general ledger number shall be related to each different type of the system's employee's, e.g. regular ed, CTE, librarian, etc.
- F. date leave requested
- G. billing rate
- H. date performed
- I. type of leave (sick, personal, professional, etc.)
- J. length of the service, full or half day
- K. the charge for the service
- L. a printable electronic leave sheet shall be generated when the employee requests a leave day and through electronic workflow, the leave request shall be forwarded to the school's principal for his/her electronic approval.
- 5. <u>Billing</u>. The Company shall submit itemized invoices on a bi-weekly basis and in the form attached hereto as EXHIBIT D. Each biweekly invoice shall cover only the dates in that biweekly period. The billing invoice and the related electronic file shall match as described in item 4 Recordkeeping. The Company shall invoice the Board for any dates prior to that biweekly period on a separate adjustment invoice. This separate adjustment invoice shall include the service date and a copy of the work orders and substitute teacher sign-in sheets shall be attached. Invoices shall be due and payable within forty-five days after the *receipt* of the invoice.
- 6. <u>Term.</u> The term of this agreement shall begin on July 1, 2016, and shall continue for one (1) year, through June 30, 2017, unless sooner terminated as provided herein. This agreement may be renewed for two (2) additional one (1) year terms upon agreement of the parties.
- 7. <u>Independent Contractor</u>. The Company shall for all purposes be considered an independent contractor, and nothing contained herein shall be construed to create a partnership or joint venture, or a relationship of principal and agent or employer and employee between the Company and the Board.
- 8. <u>Company Employees</u>. The Company shall be considered the employer of all persons performing temporary services under this agreement. The Company will recruit, interview, test, select, hire, train (in cooperation with the Board), and compensate the persons who will provide the temporary services hereunder. The Company will be solely responsible for selecting, hiring, disciplining, reviewing, evaluating and terminating its employees. The Company will be solely responsible for all contributions, taxes and assessments with respect to its employees under all applicable federal, state and local laws (specifically including withholding from wages where required).

The Company will be solely responsible for and will comply in all material respects with all federal, state and local laws or regulations applicable to the Company as an employer, including but not limited to compensation, hours of work, or other conditions of employment. The Company's employees shall not be eligible for any benefits or other prerequisites, which may be available to employees of the Board. All compensation and benefits payable to the Company's employees shall be the sole and exclusive

responsibility of the Company. The Company agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the Board and Rutherford County from and against or liability related to the Company's obligations to its employees as set out in this agreement.

- 9. Selection of Company Employees. The Company shall recruit, interview, test, select and hire employees who will perform temporary services under this agreement in accordance with the Company's policies and procedures; provided, however, that each such person shall meet the minimum requirements set out in EXHIBIT C attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof. The Company shall perform background checks at its own expense in compliance with TCA 49-5-413 (Exhibit F) on *all* of its employees who will provide services under this agreement. The Board reserves the right to review the background checks of all employees and applicants of the Company and reserves the right to accept and/or deny any employee of the Company. The Board also reserves the right to reject any employee of the company at any time based upon the employee's job performance or for whatever reason the Board determines is its sole discretion. The Company shall provide each substitute with a picture identification badge identifying him/her as an approved substitute teacher.
- 10. <u>Training of Company Employees</u>. Before providing any services under this agreement, Company employees shall successfully complete a training program conducted by the Company in cooperation with the Board. The Company shall provide a properly equipped training facility for this purpose which will accommodate at least forty (40) people. The Company will ensure the training facility is available for consecutive day usage at crucial times of the school year. In addition, the Company shall **provide** a *handbook* to each employee providing services under this agreement to be distributed as a part of training. The handbook shall be prepared in cooperation with the Board and shall include all information which may be requested by the Board, including but not limited to School safety procedures, cash collection procedures, professional behavior and ethics, dress code, etc.
- 11. <u>Insurance</u>. The Company shall maintain throughout the term of this agreement (i) workers compensation insurance coverage as required by applicable law for all Company employees performing services under this agreement, (ii) comprehensive general liability insurance with a policy limit not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence and \$1,000,000 in the aggregate, and (iii) employee fidelity bonds covering all Company employees providing services under this agreement. Each such policy shall name the Board as an additional insured. In addition, contemporaneously with the execution of this agreement, the Company shall provide a performance bond in the amount of \$500,000. The Company shall provide the Board with a certificate or certificates of insurance evidencing that the required coverages are in place.
- 12. <u>Termination</u>. In the event of material breach in this agreement, either party may terminate this agreement after giving to the other party written notice of the breach and thirty (30) days within which to cure. Upon receipt of such notice, the breaching party shall respond to the non-breaching party in writing, stating the actions to be taken to remedy the breach. If any breach is not cured within the thirty (30) day period, this agreement shall be terminated.
- 13. <u>Indemnification</u>. The Company shall indemnify and hold harmless the Board, Rutherford County, Tennessee and their respective officers, employees, agents and representatives from and against any and all actions, liability, losses, claims, and expenses, including reasonable attorneys' fees, arising or resulting from the Company's breach of the terms of this agreement or the negligence or willful misconduct of the Company or any of its officers, agents, or employees. The Board shall give reasonable notice to the Company of any Losses for which indemnity is or may be sought. The vendor will choose how they want to cover the indemnification. The Board does not require a specific method.

14. <u>Notices</u>. In the event that it becomes necessary for the Board to disclose confidential information to the Company and/or its employees so that they may effectively provide the necessary services under this agreement, the Company agrees that all such information which has been designated confidential in writing by the Board will be kept confidential by the Company and its employees.
- 16. <u>Incorporation of Request for Proposals</u>. All information supplied by the Company to the Board in connection with the Request for Proposals ("RFP") dated January 22, 2016, is hereby incorporated in this agreement by reference. The Company represents and warrants that all such information is true and correct as of the date of this agreement. The parties agree that all terms and conditions contained in the Request for Proposals, including any amendments which may have been issued, are hereby incorporated in and made a part of the terms of this agreement; provided, however that to the extent that the terms of the RFP may be in conflict with the terms of this agreement, the terms of this agreement shall be controlling.
