9. ESL EXTENDED CONTRACT (TAB 2)

The ESL Department will be conducting an after-school extended day program at Smyrna High School funded completely by Title III funds. These funds will provide 1 bilingual educational assistant extended contract. The schedule for the extended school day will run for both semesters: Monday through Wednesday from 3:45-6:15. The EA will receive \$21.00 per hour paid by Title III funds.

The ESL Department uses Title III funds to develop curriculum supports and aids. Two extended contracts are being presented for time spent in curriculum development.

10. CONTRACTUAL AGREEMENT WITH RIPPLE EFFECTS WHOLE SPECTRUM LEARNING SYSTEM (TAB 3)

The contract with Ripple Effects is for addressing behavior problems and underlying risks. This purchase is for devices per school and 50 licenses for Pre-K, K, and 1st grade. It is an evidenced based and research based social emotional learning tool. The total cost not to exceed \$98,900 during the 2019-2020 school year with a 10% maintenance fee in the following years and will be paid from required allocations from IDEA Disproportionality funds.

Rockvale HS, Riverdale HS, Central Magnet School, Eagleville School, Siegel HS and Stewarts Creek HS would like to enter into a No Cost Special Agreement to broadcast certain sports games on the NFHS Network, powered by PlayOn! Sports using a Pixellot camera system. Use of the equipment and support are no cost to the schools. This contract is for five years. At the fourth year of the agreement, the schools will receive 10% revenue sharing attributed to the school's content. If the school pays a one-time \$1,000 fee at the beginning of the contract, schools will receive a 10% revenue share beginning in the first year.

14. JOHN COLEMON ANNEX/HEAD START

Currently, Rutherford County Schools house a Head Start program in around half of the John Colemon Elementary Annex Building under a lease agreement held by Mid-Cumberland Head Start. On October 31, 2019, Mid-Cumberland Head Start passed operation responsibilities to a new interim management group, CDI. CDI has requested that RCS enter a lease with CDI containing the same or similar terms as that in place with Mid-Cumberland Head Start. It is within the Board's discretion to start the process of terminating the lease with a 90-day notice, ending it at the end of the current school year or extending a new lease.

Background

Headquartered in Atlanta, GA, PlayOn! Sports ("PlayOn") is the nation's leading high school media company and five streams more sports events than any company in the world. In 2013, PlayOn! Sports and the National Federation of State High School Associations (NFHS.org) created the NFHS Network - a joint venture that aggregates the sports media and related rights of state high school athletic associations. By combining events from state associations with events produced through PlayOn! Sports School Broadcast Program (SBP), the NFHS Network has become one of the largest direct-to-consumer sports media enterprises in the nation. This year, the NFHS Network will stream more than 250,000 live sports events and is the clear market leader for fans across the country to watch live and on demand.

Scope of Work

The Pixellot system is a comprehensive hardware + software solution that enables automated production of live events. Once it is installed and calibrated, no people are needed to create live broadcasts. PlayOn will provide eleven (11) Pixellot systems to Rutherford County ("District") that will live stream athletic (and non-athletic) events held on the following District's comprehensive campuses. The Pixellot systems will installed at each high school listed below in the main basketball gymnasium and the football/ soccer stadium; except that at Siegel High School, one Pixellot system will be installed at a location to be determined.

Cost to District

Under the terms of the Agreement, there will be no cost to the District for the use of the equipment, software, and services

Term of Contract

The initial term of the is for 5 years. After the five-year initial contract period, the District may elect to stay in the contract for as long as desired under the same terms. Because we are providing these systems to your school district at no cost, we have to make sure we can earn back our investment and we need enough time to do so. Our entire investment thesis rests on the ability to do that over 5 years. Without that ability, we would have to charge your district a cost of \$10,000 to fund the cost of the equipment and software. We understand that school districts have a challenge with multi-year agreements, particularly those that impose a cost on a future school board. But in this case, there is no cost, but we do acknowledge that the District we will be bound to use the Pixellot systems. Therefore, we have addressed with other districts by way of the following: an Early Termination Fee that states that if the contract is cancelled before the 5 years is up, there is a buyout of \$5,000 total (\$2,500 per system) that compensates us for our cost of removing, shipping, and finding a new school for the equipment. We will not prorate that cost – it is just a flat fee in the event that the School District elects to cancel for a non-contractual reason.

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Ownership of the Equipment

PlayOn retains ownership of the equipment and the software. The equipment only works with the software and the software will only broadcast to the NFHS Network. There is no inherent value to the equipment if the District is not broadcasting using the software and distributing the content to the NFSH Network.

Maintenance of the Equipment

PlayOn is responsible for the general health and welfare of the Pixellot Systems and will perform online system maintenance of all software that is installed on the units. PlayOn will handle all warranty claims on the equipment with the manufacturer and will provide District with proper containers for any equipment that needs to be returned to PlayOn for service. PlayOn will replace any broken units during the Initial Term. PlayOn is not obligated to replace any units that are destroyed by vandalism or due to negligence by District.

District Ownership of the Streamed Content

The Pixellot system's produced streams are the property of the District and all rights are reserved subject to District providing PlayOn with a worldwide, pald-up, royalty-free, sub licensable (directly and through multiple tiers) and transferrable license to reproduce, perform, transform and distribute the produced streams in any medium now existing or later developed. This license is exclusive, meaning School District may not grant these rights (or any portion of them) to any other person or entity.

Broadcasting Exclusivity

District agrees to live broadcast all regular season sports events at all competition levels in the venue where the Pixellot Systems are installed (i.e., Varsity, Junior Varsity, etc.). District has the right to determine on-demand availability of regular season events through "blackout windows." District will not permit any third party to stream any regular season sports events that would be deemed competitive with PlayOn's activities. District may allow (at its discretion) third party local television coverage to broadcast regular season events at a District without violating these restrictions. District will also broadcast via the Pixellot System on the NFHS Network any regular season event that is broadcast on linear television by a third party.

District agrees that the Pixellot Systems will be used to broadcast all TSSAA Postseason events via the Pixellot system installed in the venue where the event takes place. TSSAA media rights fees for State Postseason events produced by Pixellot Systems at District venues will be waived because the event will be distributed on the NFHS Network.

Sports/Events that will be Broadcasted

- Regular season all regular season games for the sports played in each venue at all levels: Varsity, JV, Freshman
- Special events any special event in a venue (i.e., graduation) can be broadcasted
- Playoffs all state playoffs that occur in your venues; no TSSAA rights fees have to be paid
- Practices coaches can record any practices or team workouts; these events are set as "private" (not for fans)



Football, Soccer, Lacrosse, Basketball and Volleyball all use the automated production technology to follow the action. For Wrestling a fixed field of view is established to cover one or more mats. 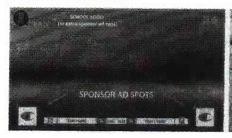

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Board of Education is planning to construct a new school located on Sledge Road in Christiana, Tennessee ("School Site"); and

WHEREAS, the existing water utility system must be upgraded and new lines installed to serve the School Site; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education desires to have CUD upgrade the water utility system and install new lines to serve the School Site in accordance with the drawing attached as Exhibit "A" (the "Project");

WHEREAS, CUD has agreed to be responsible for certain costs of upsizing certain existing water lines above twelve inch (12") lines and to extend a water line to Plainview Road; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education agrees that certain other costs incurred by CUD for the Project will be the responsibility of the Board of Education to be paid from the construction budget for the new school to be constructed on the School Site;

WHEREAS, CUD is willing to undertake the Project to serve the School site with the agreement that the Board of Education will be responsible for certain costs of the same as provided hereinbelow;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the promises and mutual agreements and conditions hereafter set forth, it is agreed between CUD and the Board of Education as follows:

- 1. CUD will cause the necessary plans and specifications to be prepared for the Project to extend the water line as shown on the drawing attached as Exhibit "A" and the costs of design and engineering the same will be the responsibility of CUD.
- 2. CUD shall be responsible to contract for the construction of the Project, but the Board of Education will be responsible to pay CUD the amount of Seven Hundred Fifty-Nine Thousand Dollars (\$759,000) towards the cost of the construction of the same as listed on Exhibit "B." CUD shall have no obligation to commence or undertake the Project until said amount is paid to CUD.

- 3. CUD will obtain any necessary easements for the Project at the expense of CUD and the costs of easements will not be a cost of the Project to be paid by the Board of Education. However, notwithstanding the same, the Board of Education agrees to grant CUD any easements reasonably required for the Project at no cost to CUD. Easements from the Board of Education must be in a form and of sufficient size to be acceptable to CUD within CUD's sole discretion.
- 4. CUD will be responsible to obtain the approval of the Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation, Division of Water Supply, ("TDEC") and other regulatory bodies, if any, exercising jurisdiction over the water system with respect to the proposed location, size of proposed pipe lines, and appurtenances thereto. Construction shall not begin until such plans are approved by TDEC. CUD is responsible for all costs associated with engineering (both design and permitting) the Project.
- 5. CUD at CUD's sole cost and expense will inspect the installation of the water lines and appurtenances thereto in accordance with CUD's plans and specifications.
- 6. In addition to the costs of the Project referenced hereinabove, the Board of Education will be responsible for the costs to install two master water meters and backflow preventers, including associated vaults and enclosures, on the school site as shown on the drawing attached as Exhibit "D", tap fees to CUD in accordance with CUD's tap fee schedule, any fees or costs related to any STEP system, if any, installed on the School Site, and water lines on the School Site. The cost of meters, tap fees, STEP system fees, and on-site water lines on the School Site are not included in the Estimate attached as Exhibit "B". After the installation of the vaults and enclosures around the backflow preventers by the Board of Education and CUD has inspected and approved the same, the maintenance of the vaults shall become the responsibility of CUD. The maintenance of the enclosures around the backflow preventers shall be the responsibility of the Board of Education.
- 7. The parties acknowledge and agree that the costs and terms associated with the twelve inch (12") water main extension from Christiana Hoovers Gap Road along the proposed School Access Road identified on Exhibit "C" will be governed by a separate Developer's Service Agreement between CUD and the Board of Education, shall be the responsibility of the Board of Education, and are not included in the costs listed on Exhibit "B."
- 8. All water lines and appurtenances thereto constructed under the terms of this agreement which are located upstream of the School's master water meter vaults shall be dedicated to CUD as non-exclusive public water utility lines which will serve both the School Site and additional properties. CUD is responsible to maintain and service said water lines and appurtenances thereto upstream plus the water piping components contained within the School's master water meter vaults. Notwithstanding the above, in the event any damage occurs to the water lines, appurtenances thereto, the master water meter vaults and piping components therein as a result of construction on the School Site, the Board of Education is responsible for the costs to repair the same. The water lines and appurtenances thereto

downstream of the master water meter vaults, including the backflow preventers and respective enclosures, shall be the responsibility of the Board of Education to maintain and service.

- 9. CUD will preserve sufficient capacity in the water lines installed pursuant to this Agreement to maintain sufficient water pressure to meet State Fire Marshall requirements for public schools to serve an elementary, middle, and high school on the School Site along with a football stadium and athletic fields. In the event any additional properties desiring to obtain water service from the water improvements constructed under this Agreement would reduce the capacity and pressurization referenced hereinabove for the School Site, CUD agrees the costs required to maintain the capacity and pressurization for the School Site will not be a responsibility of the Board of Education.
- 10. This agreement is further subject to the Rules and Regulations of the CUD, as now adopted or hereafter amended from time to time, to the extent the same are not in conflict herewith. Said Rules and Regulations are by reference hereto incorporated herein by reference as if set forth herein at length verbatim.
- 11. In the event either party brings action to enforce this Agreement, the court may award the prevailing party reasonable attorney fees in addition to any other relief said party may be entitled.
 - 12. BOTH PARTIES WAIVE THE RIGHT TO TRIAL BY JURY.
 - 13. Time is of the essence of this Agreement.

EXHIBIT "C" DRAWING SHOWING SCHOOL ACCESS ROAD

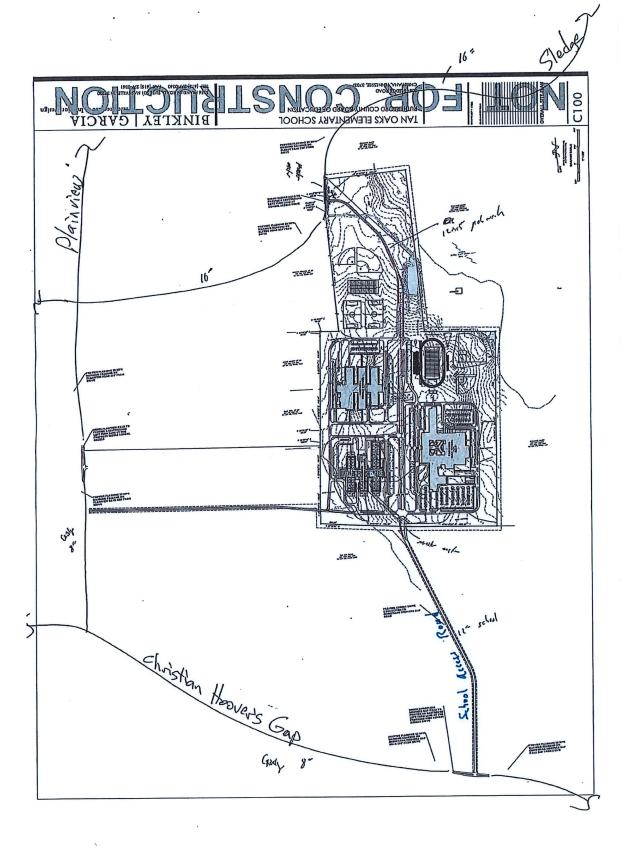
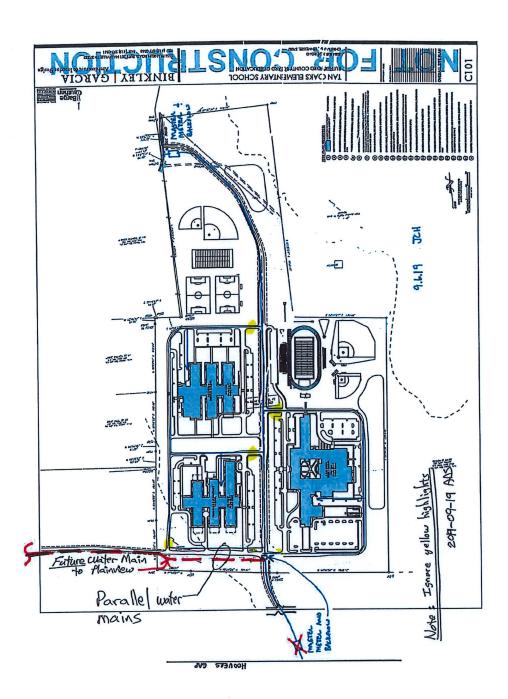


EXHIBIT "D" DRAWING SHOWING WATER METERS

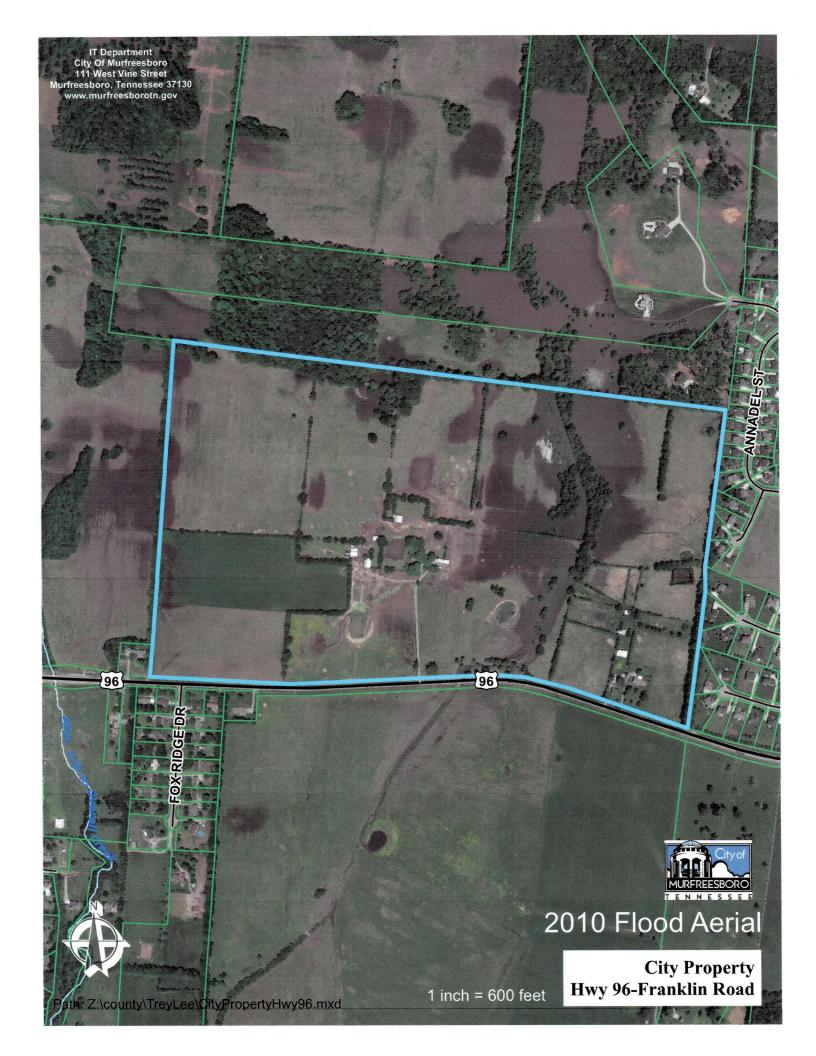














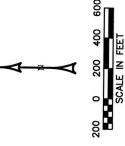


Figure 2 Site Detail Map with Photos

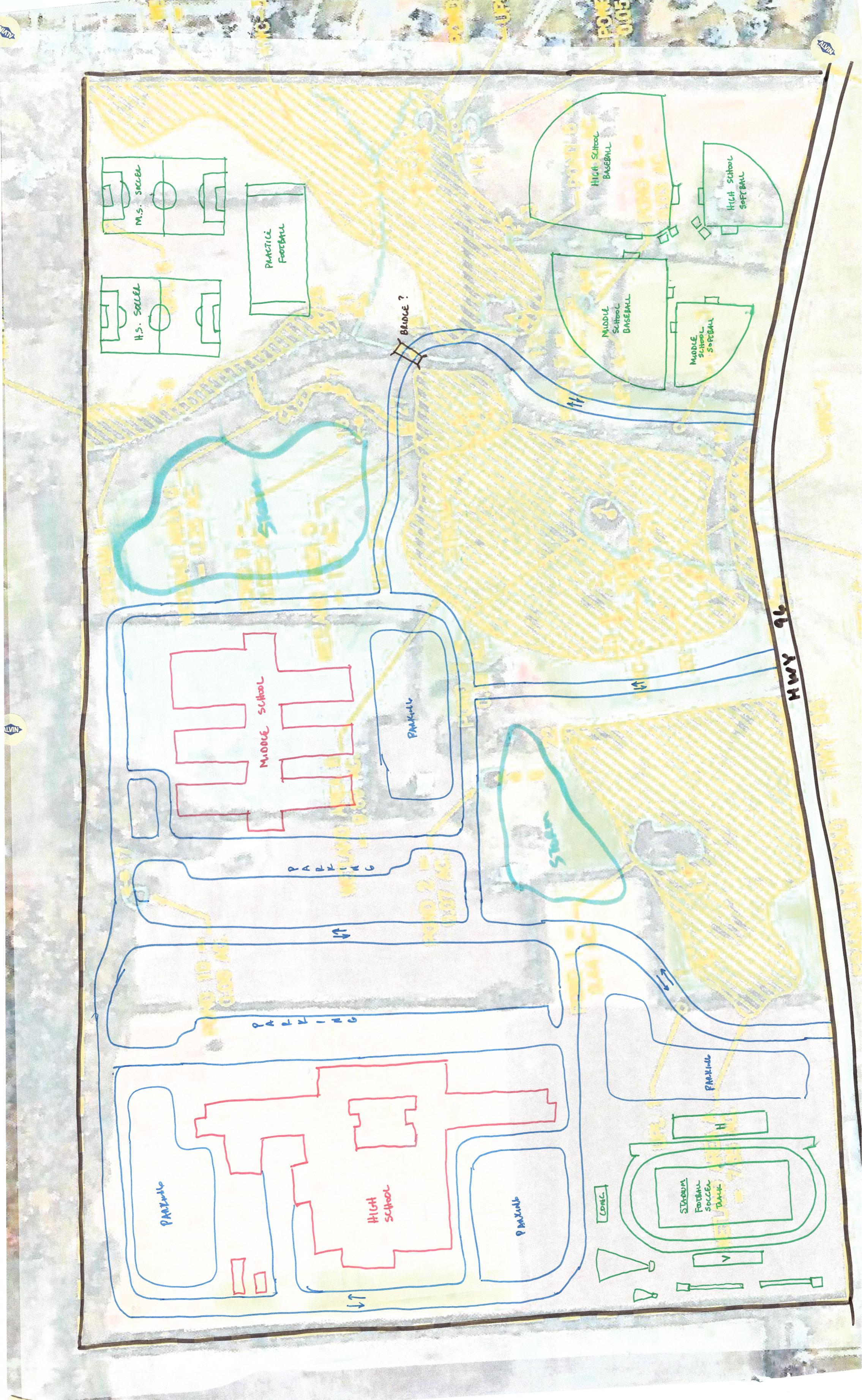

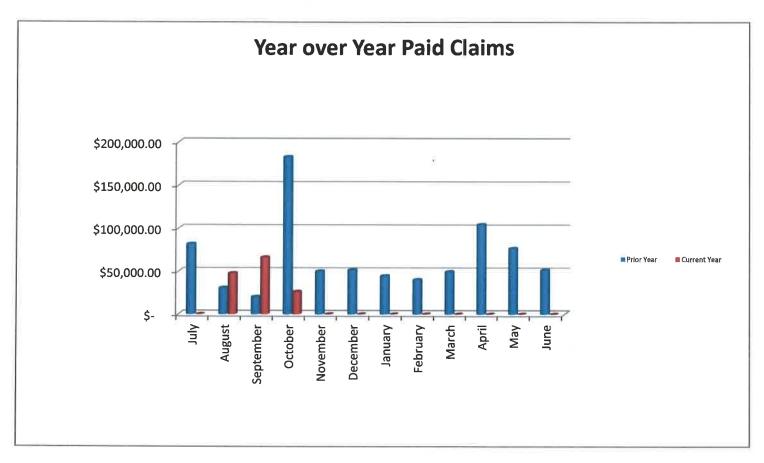
