9. INSTRUCTION (TAB 2)

I. 2025-2026 Special Courses Request

The Instruction Department is requesting permission to make an application to offer credit for special courses under the following guidelines: Rule 0520-1-3-.05-2a: "Local school systems may offer special courses not listed in 0520-1-3-.06 on an experimental basis. The Commissioner of Education must approve each course in advance each year." Rutherford County High Schools are requesting approval for the following special course requests:

- Anthropology (Renewal)
- Global Diplomacy (Renewal)
- Native American History (Renewal)
- Positive Psychology (Renewal)

• US Presidency (Renewal)

Recommended Motion - to approve, 2025-2026 special course requests for Rutherford County High Schools, as presented.

II. ESL Stipend:

The ESL department is requesting that Noemi Rodriguez, ESL teacher at Rock Springs Elementary, be paid \$1,200 (\$50 per hour) from the Title III Immigrant Grant to teach an ESL parent classes. Ms. Rodriguez is taking the place of a teacher who has resigned.

Recommended Motion – to approve the ESL stipend of \$1,200 as presented.

10. HUMAN RESOURCES

I. Additional School Nurse Position:

Request for one additional Nursing staff: due to increasing medical procedures at Riverdale and Rockvale High Schools, the Health Services Department is requesting one new School Nurse position. Currently, these two schools share a 2nd, School Nurse. This added position will allow both large high schools to have 2 School Nurses.

Recommended Motion- to approve one additional School Nurse position to cover increasing medical needs.

II. Teach Now and Grow Your Own Clinical Educator Stipend:

The Rutherford Teach Now and Grow Your Own Apprentice programs would like to allocate \$15,000.00 of General-Purpose funds to compensate clinical educators for their support of 98 Rutherford Teach Now candidates and 18 Grow Your Own apprentices. These clinical educators serve as the on-site support team for our aspiring teachers, complete mentor training, meet regularly with their apprentices, and report competency evaluations for program completion. Being assigned a clinical educator is a state requirement of both programs. The state newly requires compensation for clinical educators assigned to support GYO apprentices. The cost associated with Rutherford Teach Now clinical educator stipends are factored into the tuition and program fees collected from each candidate.

Recommended Motion – to approve the request to allocate \$15,000.00 of GP funds to provide stipends for Grow Your Own and Rutherford Teach Now clinical educators as presented.

III. 2024 - 2025 Tenure Recommendation

The following teacher(s) meet the criteria for tenure in accordance with the tenure law:

- Holds a valid Tennessee teaching license.
- Has served Rutherford County Schools for five years (45-months minimum) within a seven-year period, the last two in a regular (not interim) position.

- Has demonstrated an overall performance of "above expectations" or "significantly above expectations" on the TEAM evaluation during the last two consecutive years of the fiveyear period.
- Or if held tenure under the previous guidelines, and returned to Rutherford County Schools, meets the two-year probationary period and tenure is reactivated.

The following teacher met the criteria for tenure in accordance with the tenure law. The name below was left off the middle school tenure list presented in January in error.

11. **LEGAL (TAB 3)**

I. TSBA's Board of Distinction Program recognizes school boards for their work. School boards that seek this designation must meet specified requirements in four key areas: planning, policy, promotion, and board development. One of the requirements is an annual review and maintenance of the entire policy manual.

II. Transfer Student Under Discipline

The Board has been requested to admit a transfer student from another school system under discipline. The student was expelled for possession of marijuana.

According to Policy 6.318, the Board may deny admissions of any student (except those in state custody) when a student transfers from another school system while under suspension or expulsion.

Director of Schools' Recommendation: Deny.

Recommended Motion - to admit or deny the admission of this Transfer Student Under Discipline as presented.

III. Policy Adoption - Second Reading of Two Readings

Adds language regarding requests for retention to be in writing pursuant to State Board of Education regulation.

c. Policy 5.118 – Background Investigations

Adds language regarding background checks and FBI rap back program for employees and other individuals having proximity to students.

d. Policy 5.500 – Discrimination/Harassment of Employees

Adds language to align with state and federal law.

e. Policy 6.204 – Attendance of Non-Resident Students

Clarifies geographical boundary for non-resident students.

Recommended Motion - to adopt the above policies on the second and final reading as presented.

M.T.S.U. seeks to be a Central Magnet School sponsor.

M.T.S.U. proposes a contract in which M.T.S.U. may sponsor activities and place advertising at Central Magnet School. M.T.S.U. requests permission to place signage, which is detailed in the contract Attachment A. M.T.S.U. proposes to pay \$5,000 per year for five years. The contract terms are July 1, 2025-June 30, 2030.

Board Meeting: Kelsey Perault, OH4M SRA Education Coordinator, provided an overview of Optimal Health for Me (OH4M) along with a video presentation and handouts for the Board.

7. RUTHERFORD PROUD

Recognizing National School Counseling Week 2025.

Dr. Sullivan expressed his appreciation and support for all the school counselors and their supervisors, Amy Baltimore and Christine Bryan.

8. PUBLIC COMMENTS*

- 1) Heather Cook Ms. Cook offered clarification on her previous comments during January Public Comment. Her intent is not to attack anyone but to stand for the children. She spoke about her religious beliefs and continues to state her opposition of current books in school libraries.
- 2) Judy Beasley Whitehall Resident of Murfreesboro and praised the RCS Media Specialists and their profession. She asked the Board to demonstrate respect for librarians and for their book review recommendations. She stated that she did not

- understand how a Board of Education could remove books that could potentially help children.
- 3) Matt Fee Read a statement from David Settles, local NAACP president, regarding the Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion resolution. Mr. Fee shared his thoughts on board member politicizing and the resolutions on the agenda.
- 4) Hanna Stromgren Ms. Stromgren read excerpts from the Bible. She summarized that the Bible is filled with valuable advice but also contains offensive and sexually explicit material. She proposed the Bible be banned based on the same logic applied to the other books removed from school libraries.
- 5) Bryan Schuster He spoke to the public and asked viewers to follow (displayed) QR code to gain insight into the topics being discussed. He said it is not his objective to remove books based on personal opinions, rather because it is the law they be removed. He shared his religious beliefs and asked for the community to come together and be willing to hear one another.
- 6) Xan Lasko Addressed and questioned the Board on RCS' mission statement out of concern for the recent proposed resolutions. She asked for board members to stop proposing resolutions that work against our diverse students. She asked that they stop focusing on politics.
- 7) Lisa Thayne Mother of two, RCS student and MTSU student. She shared her opinions on the banning of books and called it censorship and quiet indoctrination. She shared TN Dept of Health statistics on teen pregnancy, sexually transmitted diseases and sexual assault. She said banning books erodes freedom. It does not help students and by banning them, it only makes the students want to read them that much more.
- 8) Chloe Donegan RCS student in opposition of banning books and feels that librarians are being slandered and vilified for doing their job. She doesn't understand why the Board is allowing this to happen and why students are being bullied into submission.
- 9) Lindsay Schultz Ms. Shultz quoted verses from the Bible. She shared her opinions on the disrespect shown to the Media Specialists. Her disappointment with the boards' decision to support lawmakers with the Diversity, Equality, and Inclusion resolution.
- 10) Michella Sturtevant Not present
- Valeria Diaz de Leon Ms. Diaz De Leon addressed the board regarding the recently passed resolution on the closure of US boarders. Although the resolution is on the agenda to be rescinded, she stated the "damage has already been done". Feels disrespected by the ESL resolution, families are afraid of immigration officials visiting their students' schools and asked for apology from the Board be given to the community.

AGREEMENT FOR SPONSORSHIP AND ADVERTISING BETWEEN MIDDLE TENNESSEE STATE UNIVERSITY AND THE RUTHERFORD COUNTY SCHOOL DISTRICT

This Agreement is made between Middle Tennessee State University ("MTSU") and the Rutherford County School District ("District") for MTSU sponsorship and advertising at high schools in the Rutherford County school system.

WHEREAS, MTSU desires to be a sponsor of activities and place advertising for MTSU in various locations at high schools in the Rutherford County school system; and

WHEREAS, the District desires to authorize high schools within its jurisdiction to accept such sponsorship and advertising.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises and agreements contained herein, the District and MTSU agree as follows:

This Agreement provides the terms and conditions under which MTSU will provide funding to high schools in the Rutherford County school system to serve as a sponsor of activities and to place advertising for MTSU at various locations as agreed by each high school. Under this Agreement, the District authorizes the high schools to accept such sponsorship and advertising. High schools will be authorized to accept sponsorship and advertising by use of the Form attached to this Agreement as Attachment A. Each completed Form shall be subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

- A. <u>Sponsorship and Advertising.</u> MTSU work with high schools to agree upon and complete the Attachment A Form to provide for MTSU funding for sponsorship of high school activities and advertisement for MTSU at high schools.
 - 1. Under each completed Attachment A, MTSU will agree to pay to the high school a sponsorship fee, which will entitle MTSU to certain recognition and the display of signage, as specified in Attachment A.
 - 2. Attachment A will detail the type and placement of signage and the rights and obligations of the school and MTSU with regard to the signage. Such detail may include, but shall not be limited to, creation and installation of the signage, whether any portion of the sponsorship fee is to be used for any specific purpose, such as purchase of a scoreboard including any specifications required for the scoreboard, and whether sponsorship rights and/or signage rights will be exclusive.
 - 3. Attachment A will set out the total sponsorship fee to be paid to the school, when and how the fee is to be paid, and the term of the sponsorship and advertising rights and how they may be terminated. Attachment A may also provide MTSU a renewal option under terms as may be agreed between the school and MTSU at the time of exercise of the option.
 - 4. Attachment A will also specify any other rights or duties of MTSU and the high school.

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ATTACHMENT A Form

This Form, Attachment A to the Agreement for Sponsorship and Advertising between Middle Tennessee State University ("MTSU") and the Rutherford County School District ("District") is to set out the specific rights and obligations of Middle Tennessee State University ("MTSU") and **Central Magnet School** ("School"), which is a high school in the District, with regard to MTSU sponsorship of School activities and placement of advertising for MTSU at School. This Attachment A is subject to the terms and conditions of the Sponsorship and Advertising Agreement between MTSU and the District, to which it is attached.

1. Sponsorship payment and rights.

Total amount to be paid, schedule, and instructions for payment -

- \$5,000 per year for five years. Fiscal years 2025-2026; 2026-2027; 2027-2028; 2028-2029; 2029-2030
- MTSU will inspect signage each year prior to making payments to ensure signage is in good condition.
- Central Magnet School will send an invoice to MTSU on or before August 1 each year.
- Checks will be payable to Central Magnet School on or before September 1 each year -2025, 2026, 2027, 2028, 2029.

Sponsorship rights of MTSU – right to advertise for MTSU in the following location(s), any specific signage requirements, and any other recognition of MTSU as sponsor –

- Auditorium: Two signs near the rear of auditorium on each side. Updated sign size to be determined.
- Gymnasium: Two scoreboards are 108" x 48". Signage installed below each scoreboard.
- Soccer: Scoreboard is 162" x 36." Signage installed below the scoreboard.

Design and installation of signage rights and duties -

- MTSU inspected current signage at the above locations on February 7, 2025, and determined that all signs need replacing due to outdated design and messaging.
- MTSU will pay to remove old signage, produce, and install the replacement signs in the existing locations after July 1, 2025 but before the first payment is due.
- MTSU will supply designs.

Other sponsorship rights or duties during the five-year agreement -

Costs of any design changes requested by MTSU will be paid by MTSU.

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- Costs to replace any damaged or degraded signage will be paid by Central Magnet School
- MTSU will supply designs.

2. Term of Attachment A.

The Term of this Attachment A shall be <u>5</u> years (July 1, 2025-June 30, 2030) and MTSU shall have an option to renew this Attachment A under terms as may be agreed between MTSU and School. This Attachment may be terminated as provided in the Agreement for Sponsorship and Advertising between Middle Tennessee State University and the Rutherford County School District.

B. Term and Termination.

- The term of this Agreement shall be from the date of last signature below until the expiration of the last Attachment A providing for sponsorship and advertisement under this Agreement.
- 2. This Agreement may be terminated as follows:

MTSU may terminate this Agreement upon thirty (30) days' prior written notice. MTSU will be responsible for notifying each high school with a current Attachment A in place. MTSU will be responsible for the cost and removal of its signage, unless otherwise agreed between MTSU and the school.

Each school with a current Attachment A in place may terminate its Attachment A upon thirty (30) days' prior written notice to MTSU. A portion of any sponsorship payments made to school by MTSU shall be repaid to MTSU by school; the fees to be repaid shall be calculated by dividing the payment made by MTSU by the number of years of the term of the Attachment A and multiplying the resulting figure by the number of years of the term that would extend beyond the year of termination had the Attachment A not been terminated.

C. Other Terms.

- 1. This Agreement shall be governed by Tennessee law, including the specific rights of the parties as Tennessee governmental entities.
- 2. The parties agree to comply with any applicable federal, state, and local laws and regulations, including such laws and regulations pertaining to non-discrimination.

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RESOLUTION OF THE RUTHERFORD COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION REQUESTING THAT THE GOVERNOR'S OFFICE DEVELOP AND FUND A GRANT PROGRAM TO SUPPORT A PILOT PROGRAM FOR THE INTEGRATION OF CHESS INSTRUCTION INTO STUDENT COURSEWORK

WHEREAS, research indicates a moderate positive effect of chess instruction on math and overall cognitive ability in primary and middle school students, as well as a smaller, yet significant, effect on reading achievement;

WHEREAS, chess training is linked to the improvement of specific cognitive skills, including, critical thinking, problem solving, planning, and memory, which are essential skills for academic success in subjects such as math, science, and language arts.

WHEREAS, Chess promotes the development of skills that reach beyond the academic setting, including discipline, focus, and perseverance, while these attributes can also support better study habits and overall academic performance.

WHEREAS, through teacher training, student engagement, research, collaboration, and community awareness, the integration of chess instruction into student coursework can be expected to produce the following outcomes:

- ➤ Improved critical thinking skills among students
- > Enhanced conflict resolution abilities
- > Increased interest in scholastic activities
- Positive impact on mathematics achievement

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Rutherford County Board of Education hereby requests that:

The Governor's Office develop and fund a three (3) year grant for a pilot program consisting of the following components and funding allocation:

- 1) Teacher Training and Chess Materials: \$70,000 annually
- 2) Workshops to train teachers in incorporating chess into their lesson plans.
- 3) Resources, curriculum materials, chess sets, and boards for teachers.
- 4) Student Engagement Events: \$5,000 annually
- 5) Events to foster a sense of community and healthy competition.
- 6) Research and Evaluation: \$15,000 annually
- 7) Collaboration with educational researchers to monitor and evaluate the impact of chess instruction on scholastic achievement.
- 8) Regular assessment of the cognitive and educational effects of the program.

- 9) Program Administration and Outreach: \$10,000 annually
- 10) Administrative support
